V-10.00 Policy on Course Substitution or Waiver Based upon Disability

I. POLICY STATEMENT

Rehnbilitation Act of 1973 (as amended) and the American with Disabilities Act of 1990 (as amended), provides the following process for students with disabilities to seek course substitutions or waivers for general education courses or program elective. The University reserves the right to amend this Policy as circumstances require.

II. PURPOSE

To provide guidance to otherwise qualified students with documented disabilities on the process for requesting course substitutions and/or waivers.

III. DEFINITIONS

- 1. <u>Accommodation:</u> an adjustment or modification in the academic environment that enables an individual to enjoy equal access to the University's programs, services or activities, including auxiliary aids and services.
- 2. <u>Disability:</u> Any physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; or having a record of such an impairment; or being regarded as having such impairment.

IV. RULES AND PROCEDURES

A. General Rules

- 1. Requests for course substitution and/or waivers will be considered on a caseby-case basis.
